This session is based on activities sponsored by the Cleveland Humanities Collaborative, a grant-funded partnership between Cuyahoga Community College and Case Western Reserve University, along with participation from Lorain County Community College and Lakeland Community College. Students at Tri-C and CWRU engage in programming as part of an initiative to bring awareness to careers in the humanities through structured activities and academic majors for community college students interested in matriculating to humanities-focused bachelor's degree programs.
